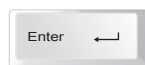

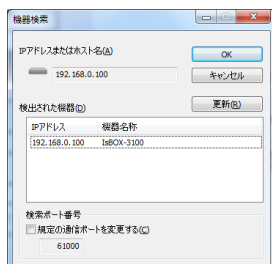

# インストールする

- 1** コンピューターの電源を入れ、「セットアップディスク」CD-ROM を入れます。
  - ・インストールプログラムが自動的に起動し、インストールメニュー画面が表示されます。
  - ・自動再生の画面が表示されたときは、[InstMenu.exe の実行] をクリックします。
  - ・「ユーザーアカウント制御」の画面が表示されたら、[許可]（または [はい]）をクリックします。
  - ・インストールプログラムが自動的に起動しない場合は、「セットアップディスク」CD-ROM 中の「InstMenu.exe」アイコンをダブルクリックしてください。
- 2** インストールメニュー画面から、[ドライバーインストール] をクリックします。
- 3** 使用許諾契約が表示されます。内容をよくお読みいただき、ご同意いただける場合は、[同意する] をクリックします。  
[同意しない]または[戻る]をクリックすると、インストールメニュー画面に戻ります。

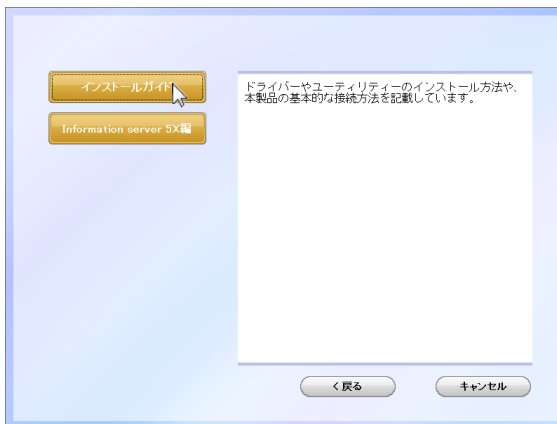
